

The Korjaamo culture factory is founded on a new concept of urban space where the creators of art and culture and their works mix and mingle with the viewing public.

In June 2008 Korjaamo has expanded and consists now of two big spaces called Korjaamohalli (Korjaamo Hall) and Vaunuhalli (Streetcar Hall). They are both originally tram depots. After expanding Korjaamo is leading culture center in Finland.

Korjaamo hosts a bar, a café, a garden, three gallery spaces, shop and two event spaces: Kulmasali (Corner Room) and Vaunusali (Streetcar Room) for theatre, clubs and concerts. Both event spaces are for hire and can be used for any kind of happenings. At the same time Korjaamo hosts in Vaunuhalli Tram Museum which is part of Helsinki City Museum. All these spaces and happenings are contributing to an innovative, energetic community in a centre of urban culture, mixing contemporary European and Finnish culture.

Verkatehdas is an organic and accessible combination of industrial heritage and modern architecture. The unique atmosphere and character of the old industrial buildings are preserved.

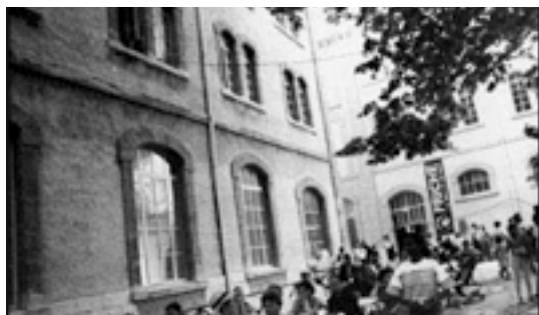

Kulturzentrum Schlachthof



In 1978, young people occupied the building of a former slaughterhouse in the heart of Bremen. A citizens initiative was founded and the idea of an independent and non-profit culture centre was born. It was a time of social and political movement with various groups looking for places for cultural activities and rooms to meet and to discuss.

Schlachthof organises nearly 200 events and has more than 120.000 visitors every year. The centre has a music programme which ranges from international stars to new bands and local musicians. Schlachthof has rehearsal rooms for young bands and the centre supports them in their bid for recognition.

Every year the centre organises an international youth theatre festival with groups from all over Europe and the US. Schlachthof also publishes the monthly ZETT-culture-magazine with articles about cultural, social or political themes and its programme in co-operation with another culture centre.

In the heart of Leipzig, nestled behind the Gewandhaus Concert Hall and City Skyscraper, you find the Moritzbastei, the only remaining part of the ancient city fortifications. The Moritzbastei was commissioned by Elector Moritz of Saxony in the 16th century and later named after him. It survived 400 tumultuous years during which it was used in many different ways, only to end as part of the rubble of the Second World War.

In 1974 students began to work on the Moritzbastei, freeing it of the debris it was filled with and turning it into a students' club, which opened in 1982. For almost 10 years the club was a students' club, but in 1989, after the fall of the Berlin Wall, the Moritzbastei opened its doors to all visitors interested in culture. The MB has something for everyone, from rock and jazz concerts through readings and play performances to exhibitions and discussions. And those people who are simply looking for a cosy place to enjoy a glass of wine or a snack will be charmed by the atmosphere in the Café Barbakane or one of the comfortable bars. In the summer of 1979 more than 100 people peacefully took over the desolate grounds of the former film company UFA and created a comprehensive work and living project.

Today the centre is a 'green cultural oasis' in the middle of Berlin - a space for creation and culture, for innovative ideas and sustainable development a productive surrounding for the citizens of Berlin and for artists from all over the world.

The 18.000 square meter space is divided into various areas, two podiums are open year-round for artistic productions: world music, cabaret, conferences, Variété, dance theatre, comedy, children's circus and more.

UfaFabrik as a roof organisation employs between 120 to 200 people, depending on the season, and hosts approximately 200.000 visitors per year.

Konstepidemin - The Epidemic of Art was founded in 1987. In the 1970s and 1980s there was a shortage of cheap premises in the central parts of Gothenburg, as many areas in the city were due for renovation and rebuilding. It was almost impossible for artists to find somewhere to work. Rents were raised, but artists' income were not. To acquire cheap studios and workshops has always been a fundamental problem for all free creative workers. The Epidemic of Art is run by an independent group of artists. The Epidemic of Art is basically self-financed. The main income comes from letting out the studios to the artists. Some of the projects are also financially supported by the city of Gothenburg and the government. The Epidemic of Art is situated in the centre of Gothenburg and consists of ten buildings and a large park. There is more than 4 000 m2 of total studio area. We have around 100 studios with many different artistic groups represented, for example, designers, silversmiths, painters, writers, ceramic artists, sculptors, textile artists, photographers, film producers, actors and the Göteborg Film Festival.
